Application Overview

Open to any AVAC Alumni interested in serving as a mentor to emerging HIV prevention advocates currently residing in Southern or Eastern Africa:

- 6-month program in HIV prevention advocacy
- One-on-one mentorship with 1-2 hour/week commitment per Navigator (program participant)
- Modest communication and mentorship stipend

Advocacy Navigator Program

The Advocacy Navigator is an AVAC initiative combining training and mentorship to young and emerging advocates in the field of HIV prevention advocacy. The program mobilizes a cohort of ambitious individuals and empowers them with the knowledge, skills, and confidence to meaningfully engage with and participate in HIV prevention advocacy by providing online coursework, personalized mentorship, and opportunities to directly apply learning through a Community Advocacy Project. The program works with AVAC Advocacy Fellows program Alumni as mentors to connect participants, or “Navigators,” to AVAC’s growing global network, bolstering existing campaigns and fueling advocacy efforts. The program involves three months of coursework and project development, followed by three months of “implementation” whereby Navigators implement all or a portion of their Community Advocacy Project plan with the support of their mentor.

Program Benefits & Support (Navigators)

Participation in the program is free for all accepted Navigators, who can expect to receive:

- Capacity strengthening and skills building through online coursework
- Mentorship
- Networking
- Communication stipend
- Project Grant to implement a Community Advocacy Project
- Certificate of Completion

Navigator Eligibility

- The program is open to any full-time, part-time, volunteer, or unemployed individuals located in Eastern and Southern Africa
- The program encourages applicants with an interest in HIV prevention advocacy and those who ally or identify with key populations
- AVAC strongly encourages former and/or future applicants to the AVAC Advocacy Fellows Program who were not selected



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- Applicants must have access to internet, access to a personal or work laptop or computer, and their own mobile phone
- Applicants must be able to commit to a minimum of 3-4 hours per week to the program
- Applicants must have the support from their employer or volunteer organization to commit the time to program (this is not required for applicants who are not currently employed)
- Applicants must be English-speaking

Program Benefits & Support (Mentors)

Mentors selected to participate in the program can expect to:

- **Leadership Experience:** serving as experts in the field, mentors can expect to sharpen their leadership and communication skills
- **Skills Refresher:** have an opportunity to refresh and update their knowledge and skills in the field of HIV prevention and advocacy
- **Networking:** connect with emerging advocates in the field to build the movement of allies and empower the next generation of HIV prevention advocacy leaders
- **Communication Stipend:** receive a modest monthly stipend to offset any data and communication expenses required to fully participate in the program
- **Mentorship Stipend:** receive a modest monthly stipend of \$300 to support two Navigators

Mentor Eligibility

- The program is open to any full-time, part-time, volunteer, or unemployed AVAC Alumni located in Eastern and Southern Africa
- Applicants must have access to internet, a personal or work laptop or computer, and a mobile phone
- Priority will be given to prospective mentors with an interest in gaining experience in mentorship and building their leadership skills
- Applicants must be English-speaking



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Program Expectations

Throughout the course of the 6-month program, mentors will be expected to:

- Attend a pre-program mentorship and communication training
- Commit to mentoring two Navigators (program participants)
- Commit a minimum of 1-2 hours per week to meeting with each Navigator to answer questions, review online coursework assignments, support work on their Community Advocacy Project, and other topics as they arise
- Engage in regular meetings with their assigned Navigators
- Support each Navigator to design and implement a Community Advocacy Project
- Introduce each Navigator to a minimum of 4 individuals in their professional network to support them in building their own professional network
- Support each participant in developing a 1-page concept note of short and long-term goals describing how they plan to continue to engage in HIV prevention advocacy work beyond the program
